

Fraud, Waste & Abuse Reporting

Healthcare fraud, waste and abuse affect all of us. Healthcare fraud significantly impacts the Medicaid program by using up valuable public funds needed to help vulnerable children and adults access health care.

Some signs of fraud, waste or abuse might be:

- Someone being asked to sign a worker's blank time card;
- Providing unnecessary services;
- Billing more than once for the same service; or
- Billing for more service than was provided.

Or when someone:

- Lies about their eligibility;
- Lies about their medical condition;
- Sells their prescription drugs to someone else; or
- Loans their Medicaid card to another person.
